1. **Approval of Minutes** of the January 27, and January 28, 2010 meetings of the Texas Transportation Commission
 2. **Aviation**
112144 **Various Counties** – Award federal and state grant funding for airport improvement projects at various locations (MO)
Federal law authorizes the award of federal funding to preserve and improve the state's general aviation system. State law authorizes the award of state funding for capital improvement projects. The airports listed in Exhibit A are eligible for award of these grant funds and AVN seeks approval of the awards.
 3. **Public Transportation**
 - a. **112145** **Various Counties** – Award federal §5310 funds, Special Needs of Elderly Individuals and Individuals with Disabilities Program, and award transportation development credits for FY 2010 (MO)
The awards identified in this minute order reflect the allocation of federal grant funds from the Federal Transit Administration §5310, Elderly Individuals and Individuals with Disabilities Program, to various public transportation providers. Transportation development credits are awarded to various transportation agencies to assist with the match of federal funds for capital projects.
 - b. **112146** **Various Counties** – Award federal §5311 funds, Nonurbanized Area Formula Program for FY 2010 (MO)
The awards identified in this minute order reflect the allocation of federal grant funds from the Federal Transit Administration §5311, Nonurbanized Area Formula Program, to rural public transportation providers.

3. **Public Transportation (continued)**
- 112147 c. **Harris County** – Award transportation development credits to Greater Southeast Management District (MO)
The award identified in this minute order will assist with the required match to federal transit funds to carry out infrastructure improvements that will enhance transit/pedestrian access in the City of Houston.
- 112148 d. **Various Counties** – Award transportation development credits to Brazos Transit District, Golden Crescent Regional Planning Commission, and the Rolling Plains Management Corporation (MO)
The awards identified in this minute order will assist with the required match to federal transit funds for various capital transit projects.
- 112149 e. **Various Counties** – Award federal §5316 funds, Job Access Reverse Commute Program, and transportation development credits to Golden Crescent Regional Planning Commission (MO)
The award identified in this minute order will award a remaining grant balance of Federal Transit Administration §5316, Job Access Reverse Commute Program, funds and transportation Development credits to Golden Crescent Regional Planning Commission.
4. **Promulgation of Administrative Rules** Under Title 43, Texas Administrative Code, and the Administrative Procedure Act, Government Code, Chapter 2001:
- a. **Final Adoption**
Chapter 25 – Traffic Operations (MO)
112150 Amendments to §25.973, Medical Examiner's Report (Crash Records Information System)
Senate Bill 1218, 81st Legislature, requires medical examiners to report to the department fatalities that are a result of a bridge collapse. The proposed amendment will bring the existing rule regarding this report into compliance with the new requirements.
- b. **Proposed Adoption**
(to be published in the Texas Register for public comment)
112151 (1) **Chapter 8 – Motor Vehicle Distribution; Chapter 17 – Vehicle Titles and Registration; Chapter 18 – Motor Carriers (MO)**
Repeal of Chapter 8, Motor Vehicle Distribution; Repeal of Chapter 17, Vehicle Titles and Registration; and Repeal of Chapter 18, Motor Carriers
As a result of the transfer of department functions concerning motor vehicle distribution, vehicle titles and registration, and registration of motor carriers and motor transportation brokers to the Texas Department of Motor Vehicles, these chapters are no longer necessary.

4. b. **Proposed Adoption (continued)**
- 112152 (2) **Chapter 9 – Contract and Grant Management and Chapter 31 – Public Transportation (MO)**
New §9.130, Purpose, §9.131, Definitions, §9.132, Applicability, §9.133, Procedure for Imposing Sanctions, §9.134, Improvement Action Plan, §9.135, Withholding Funds or Disallowing Costs, §9.136, Suspension or Termination for Cause, §9.137, Determination of Ineligibility, §9.138, Appeal of Sanction, and §9.139, Lessening Terms or Removal of Sanction (New Subchapter H, Grant Sanctions); and Amendments to §31.3, Definitions (General) and §31.48, Project Oversight (Program Administration)
New Subchapter H is proposed to develop sanctions for grantees that are not in compliance with policy, rule, regulation, or law.
- 112153 (3) **Chapter 25 – Traffic Operations (MO)**
Amendments to §25.23, Speed Zone Studies (Procedures for Establishing Speed Zones)
The existing Procedures for Establishing Speed Zones allow for the creation of interim speed limits on a new highway or on a reconstructed highway. The proposed amendment will clarify the process and procedures used when creating an interim speed limit.
5. **American Recovery and Reinvestment Act**
Report Only Discussion of the status of American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) project delivery; approve additions and changes to the lists of mobility and preventive maintenance and rehabilitation projects previously approved for funding from Texas' portion of the ARRA (MO)
The ARRA created an economic stimulus package that provides for investment in transportation infrastructure projects. Staff will update the commission on the department's efforts to deliver ARRA-funded projects to construction letting. This agenda item will allow the commission to approve additional projects, using the under run of ARRA funds on previously approved projects, and changes to the lists of mobility and preventive maintenance and rehabilitation projects.
6. **Proposed Federal Economic Stimulus Legislation**
Deferred Approve transportation projects to be funded from Texas' portion of the second federal economic stimulus bill (MO)
Congress is currently considering a second economic stimulus package that will provide for investment in transportation infrastructure projects. This agenda item will allow the commission to approve a list of specific projects across the state to be funded from the program, in the event that such legislation is passed by the date of this meeting.

7. **Proposition 12 Bonds**
Various Counties – Approval of work to be performed in connection with highway improvement projects that will be funded with the proceeds from bonds issued under Transportation Code, Section 222.004 (Proposition 12 Bonds) (MO)
The Texas Legislature passed enabling legislation authorizing the commission to issue general obligation bonds, for the purpose of paying all or part of the cost of highway improvement projects. For FY 2010-2011, the Legislature appropriated \$90 million for right of way, \$60 million for engineering, and \$850 million for progress payments on no more than \$1.85 billion of non-tolled highway improvement project awards. In cooperation with the state's transportation partners, the department has developed a list of potential projects to be funded with these newly available funds. This minute order provides commission approval of the department's recommendation and a list containing work to be performed in connection with each project.

8. **Proposition 14 Bonds**
a. Approve the supplemental resolution authorizing the issuance of State Highway Fund revenue bonds issued under Transportation Code, Section 222.003 (Proposition 14 Bonds), any amendments to the master resolution, the preliminary official statement and other documents relating to the issuance of the bonds, and authorize designated department officials to take all action necessary to deliver one or more series of bonds, including refunding bonds (MO)
This action authorizes the chief financial officer and other designated department officials to move forward with the issuance of additional state highway fund revenue bonds as authorized under Transportation Code, Section 222.003 (Proposition 14 Bonds).

- b. **Various Counties** – Approval of additional projects to be funded with the proceeds of State Highway Fund revenue bonds issued under Transportation Code, Section 222.003 (Proposition 14 Bonds) (MO)
The commission is adding additional mobility projects to the list of previously approved projects. Funds are available for these additional projects due to lower than estimated bids in other approved projects.

9. **Pass-Through Toll Program**
Authorize the designation of a period of time in 2010 for public and private entities to submit proposals under the pass-through toll program to develop highway projects on the state highway system and prescribe the conditions that will be applicable to the proposals under Title 43, Texas Administrative Code, Section 5.54 (MO)
The department is required by Rider 63 of the 2009 General Appropriations Act to encumber an amount of reimbursements under new pass-through toll agreements during the 2010-2011 biennium that is not less than the total reimbursements committed under agreements entered into during the 2008-2009 biennium. This minute order will authorize the first program call for 2010 and establish the period of time for the submissions, the estimated amount of funds available to be allocated, and the categories of cost that will be considered as eligible reimbursement under the program call.

10. **Toll Projects**

- a. **Harris County** – Designate the tolled mainlanes on SH 99 (Grand Parkway), from SH 249 to I-45 in Harris County, as a toll project on the state highway system(MO)

The department received final environmental clearance from the Federal Highway Administration on SH 99 from SH 249 to I-45 as a toll facility on December 31, 2009. This minute order designates the tolled mainlanes on SH 99 from SH 249 to I-45 as a toll project on the state highway system.

- b. **Cameron County** – Consider a request from the Cameron County Regional Mobility Authority to extend the limits of the SH 550 project previously approved under Minute Order 112013, dated October 29, 2009, and authorize the executive director to enter into a project development agreement for the SH 550 project, a new 9.6 mile limited access toll facility extending southeast from US 77/83 to SH 48 (at the new Port of Brownsville entrance) (MO)

Transportation Code, §370.033(f) authorizes a regional mobility authority to develop a project within its boundaries on behalf of the department. The improvement of the state highway system by an RMA is subject to commission approval. In Minute Order 112013, dated October 29, 2009, the commission authorized the executive director to enter into a project development agreement for the SH 550 project with limits from approximately 1.1 miles west of FM 1847 to approximately 0.7 miles east of FM 1847, and from approximately 0.7 miles north of FM 3248 to SH 48 at the new Port of Brownsville entrance. The Cameron County Regional Mobility Authority has requested that the limits of the project be extended to run southeast along SH 550 from US 77/83 to SH 48 (at the new Port of Brownsville entrance). American Recovery and Reinvestment Act funding has been approved for the project.

11. **Private Activity Bond Surface Transportation Corporation**

- a. Appoint director to the Texas Private Activity Bond Surface Transportation Corporation (MO)

The commission authorized the creation of the corporation and appointed three directors to the corporation's board in October 2008. There is now a vacancy on the board.

- b. Request the Texas Private Activity Bond Surface Transportation Corporation (corporation) perform the functions authorized by Transportation Code, Chapter 431, Texas Transportation Corporation Act (Act) and any other functions not specified by the Act necessary to promote and develop the transportation facilities and systems being developed under the concession agreement for the I-635 Managed Lanes Project with private developers through the issuance of tax-exempt private activity bonds by the corporation and transfer of inducement and volume cap allocation as necessary (MO)

Under the Act, the commission is required to take action requesting the corporation perform certain functions not specified by the Act as necessary to finance the I-635 Managed Lanes Project and issue private activity bonds for the project, such as loaning any bond proceeds to the developer pursuant to a loan agreement. Additionally, certain actions were taken by the commission and department prior to creation of the corporation that need to be transferred to the corporation to ensure the tax-exemption of interest on any private activity bonds issued such as the inducement for certain projects (filing applications for volume cap with FHWA) and the volume cap allocation.

12. **Rail**
- 112161 **Various Counties** – Authorize the expenditure of a \$2 million federal appropriation from the 2010 Omnibus Act for the rehabilitation of the South Orient Railroad from Fort Stockton to Coleman (MO)
The South Orient Railroad is a state-owned facility that is leased to Texas Pacifico Transportation, Ltd. The line is in need of significant rehabilitation to support continued rail service and economic development opportunities. The federal 2010 Omnibus Act included a \$1 million appropriation for rehabilitation of the line between San Angelo and Coleman and a \$1 million appropriation for rehabilitation of the line between San Angelo and Fort Stockton (total \$2 million). The department proposes to combine this appropriation with previously authorized American Recovery and Reinvestment Act funds, previously authorized state funds, and lessee contributions for track rehabilitation, bridgework, and crossing repairs along the rail line.
13. **Finance**
- 112162 a. Accept the annual continuing disclosure report for the Texas Mobility Fund (MO)
Under provisions of the Supplemental Resolutions to the Master Resolution for the Texas Mobility Fund, the commission agreed to provide annual updates for operating and financial information provided in the official statements. Updates are due within six months of each fiscal year end.
- 112163 b. Accept the annual continuing disclosure report for the State Highway Fund revenue bonds (MO)
Under provisions of the Supplemental Resolutions to the Master Resolution for the State Highway Fund bonds, the commission agreed to provide annual updates for operating and financial information provided in the official statements. Updates are due within six months of each fiscal year end.
- 112164 c. **Travis and Williamson Counties** – Accept the annual continuing disclosure report for the Central Texas Turnpike System (MO)
Under provisions of the Indenture of Trust for the Central Texas Turnpike System bonds, the commission agreed to provide annual updates for operating and financial information provided in the official statements. Updates are due within six months of each fiscal year end.
14. **State Infrastructure Bank**
- 112165 a. **Final Approval – Amendment**
El Paso County – **Camino Real Regional Mobility Authority** – Consider amending Minute Order 112082, passed December 17, 2009, to authorize a change in the security and repayment terms for the \$35 million State Infrastructure Bank loan to Camino Real Regional Mobility Authority (CRRMA) (MO)
The CRRMA and the department agreed to financial terms for repayment of a \$35 million SIB loan that included a 30 year repayment period at 6.0 percent interest per annum with security for the loan in the form of Transportation Reinvestment Zone tax revenue provided by the City of El Paso. The proposed amendment to these terms is requested by the CRRMA to provide an alternative structure for financing the repayment of the loan and a reduction in the rate of interest per annum.
- 112166 b. **Final Approval**
Williamson County – **City of Florence** – Consider granting final approval of an application from the City of Florence to borrow \$138,190 from the State Infrastructure Bank to pay for utility relocation costs along SH 195 (MO)
The City of Florence will use the loan to pay for utility relocation costs of a water line along SH 195 from 0.805 miles south of the Bell County Line to 3.4 miles south of SH 138.

15. **Transportation Planning**

112167

- a. **Appoint three members to the Port Authority Advisory Committee (MO)**
State law requires the commission to appoint a seven-member Port Authority Advisory Committee to advise the commission and the department on port issues and to provide a forum for exchange of information between the commission, the department, and committee members representing the Texas port system. The terms of three existing members will expire February 28, 2010.

- b. **Hidalgo County – Correct typographical error in Minute Order 111442, dated July 31, 2008, which approved projects for funding under the Border Colonia Access Program (MO)**
The commission approved projects for funding under the third call of the Border Colonias Access Program by Minute Order 111442, dated July 31, 2008. Hidalgo County was awarded \$104,724 for a population allocation project identified as Colonia Esperanza #1. The department has determined that the documentation submitted by the county contained a typographical error and the project described in the application is actually Colonia Esperanza #2. This minute order will allow the commission to correct that error and award the funds to Colonia Esperanza #2.

- c. **Various Counties – Approve revisions to the Capital Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (CAMPO) Metropolitan Area Boundary (MO)**
Federal law requires that a metropolitan planning area boundary cover the existing urbanized area and the contiguous geographic area expected to become urbanized within a 20-year forecast period covered by the MPO's metropolitan transportation plan; and may encompass the entire metropolitan statistical area, as defined by the Bureau of the Census. Bastrop and Caldwell counties are part of the Austin-Round Rock Metropolitan Statistical Area. Revisions to metropolitan planning area boundaries must be approved by the governor who has delegated the authority to approve such changes to the Texas Transportation Commission. CAMPO currently serves as the MPO for Hays, Travis, and Williamson counties.

- d. **Various Counties – Approve the Relief from Local Matching Funds (Economically Disadvantaged Counties Program) Report (MO)**
This report documents the use of matching funds and local incentives as well as the savings to counties participating in the Economically Disadvantaged Counties Program. State law requires the commission to provide an annual report on the program to the governor, the lieutenant governor and the speaker of the House of Representatives.

- e. **Cameron County – Approve revising the conditions of Minute Orders 110690 dated September 28, 2006 and 111982 dated September 24, 2009 regarding authorization of the Brownsville West Railroad Relocation project and use of \$13 million in Category 6, Railroad Grade Separation funds committed to the project (MO)**
This minute order supplements Minute Orders 110690 and 111982 which the commission entered into September 2006 and September 2009 respectively, concerning Cameron County's development of the Brownsville West Rail Relocation project. Both minute orders are automatically cancelled if by March 1, 2010 the county does not meet the terms required under these minute orders. This order removes the deadline, and instead requires the county to meet the terms before the state will authorize the county to award the construction contract. This order also removes the requirement for the terms to be met before the project can be authorized for letting, and instead requires the county to meet the terms before the state will authorize the county to award the contract.

16. **Obligation Limit Report**

Status report on the FY 2010 Obligation Limit and report on the actual obligations utilized through February 2010 and proposed remaining highway maintenance and construction contract letting for the fiscal year.

This report will provide the current overall obligation status, by district, of the FY 2010 Obligation Limit and will also provide the anticipated effect on the obligation limit of remaining proposed highway maintenance and construction letting.

17. **Contracts**

a. **Award or Reject Highway Improvement Contracts**

Proposed MO will conditionally award contract(s) to low bidders allowing the department to enter into contract(s) for highway improvements, or reject all bids for select projects, allowing the department to re-bid those projects. Conditions required for award may include securing of funding from other sources and the contractor's ability to meet federal DBE contracting requirements.

112173 (2) **Highway and Transportation Enhancement Building Construction** (see attached itemized list) (MO)

112174 b. **Gregg County – Project RMC 6202-41-001.** Award of right of way mowing and litter removal contract to second lowest bidder (MO)

Apparent low bidder failed to enter into contract with the department. The minute order authorizes the department to award ROW mowing & litter removal contract to second low bidder at the first low bidder's price.

a. **Donations to the Department**

112175 (1) **Bridge Division** – Acknowledge a donation from the Portland Cement Association (PCA) for two department employees' travel expenses to attend the 2010 Concrete Bridge Conference and AASHTO Committee on Concrete Design (T-10) Meeting in Phoenix, Arizona on February 24 – 25, 2010 (MO)

The visits will enable department employees' to exchange ideas and state-of-the-art information and technology for concrete bridge design, fabrication and construction.

112176 (2) **Bryan District** – Consider a donation from St. Joseph Catholic School for half the cost to install a flashing beacon at the intersection of Rye School Road and Old San Antonio Road (OSR) in Brazos County (MO)

The flashing beacon will provide additional safety for school children and visitors that attend events and practice at this athletic complex..

112177 (3) **Houston District** – Consider a donation from Newland Communities for landscape improvements within the right of way on the north side of US 59 at the intersection with University Boulevard in Sugar Land (MO)

The landscape improvements will provide cohesive appearance with the existing landscape.

- (4) **Houston District** – Consider a donation from Taylor Morrison for landscape improvements and decorative wall within the right of way on the south side and medians of SH 96 at the intersection of MarBella Parkway in League City (MO)

- (5) **Travel Information Division** – Consider a donation from the Corpus Christi Convention and Visitors Bureau to provide food, beverages, and admission and transportation to area attractions, by various sponsors, to the department for distribution to attendees of the 55th Annual Texas Travel Counselors Conference in Corpus Christi on April 26-29, 2010, which the department is hosting (MO)

The donation allows the department to exchange information and ideas with those in attendance which will be a great benefit to the department.

b. **Eminent Domain Proceedings**

- Various Counties** – noncontrolled and controlled access highways (see attached itemized list) (MO)

Commission findings, determinations, and authorizations for the state to acquire by eminent domain, upon the payment of adequate and just compensation, various ownership interests in specific parcels of real property that are needed to develop or improve both non-controlled and controlled access state highways, to include requesting the state attorney general to bring and pursue condemnation suits relating to those specific parcels of real property described in the attached itemized list, for which negotiations with the property owners were unsuccessful.

c. **Highway Designation**

112181

- Dimmit and Frio Counties** – Extend the designation of FM 65 along SH 85 between Brundage and Dilley (MO)

Local officials have requested this designation of FM 65, a distance of approximately 31.5 miles.

d. **Load Zones & Postings**

112182

- Various Counties** – Revise load restrictions on various bridges on the state highway system (MO)

This minute order authorizes the placement, revision, or removal of load postings on various bridges on the state-maintained highway system.

e. **Right of Way Dispositions and Donations**

112183

The commission must approve the sales, transfers and exchanges of state rights of way and other real properties that are no longer needed for a state highway purpose. It must also approve, accept and acknowledge donations to the state of real property that is valued at \$500 or more.

- (1) **Limestone County** – SH 164 at FM 937 in Groesbeck – Consider the sale of surplus right of way to the abutting landowner (MO)

The district has determined that the surplus land is no longer needed for highway purposes. The county has no interest in acquiring it, and it may be sold to the abutting landowner.

e. **Right of Way Dispositions and Donations**

- (2) **Lubbock County** – Business US 87-G and FM 835 in Lubbock – Consider the removal from the system of BU 87-G and a segment of FM 835, transfer of control, jurisdiction and maintenance and transfer of right of way to the city and designation of 50th Street as FM 835 from I-27 to State Spur 331 (MO)

The district has determined that the surplus land is no longer needed for state highway purposes or as part of the system. The city has agreed to accept control, jurisdiction and maintenance. The surplus land may be transferred to the city, since the estimated cost of future maintenance exceeds the fair value of the property. The district has further determined that 50th Street should be designated on the system as FM 835.

- (3) **Rockwall County** – FM 552 northeast of Red Valley Run – Consider the sale of surplus right of way to the abutting landowners (MO)

The district has determined that the surplus land is no longer needed for highway purposes. The county has no interest in acquiring it, and it may be sold to the abutting landowners.

- (4) **Upshur County** – US 259 at Shamrock Road south of Ore City – Consider the sale of surplus right of way to the abutting landowner (MO)

The district has determined that the surplus land is no longer needed for highway purposes. The county has no interest in acquiring it, and it may be sold to the abutting landowner.

- (5) **Wichita County** – US 287, north of Third Street in Wichita Falls – Consider the sale of surplus right of way to the city (MO)

The district has determined that the surplus land is no longer needed for highway purposes. The city of Wichita Falls is interested in acquiring the surplus land, and it may be sold to the city.

- Various Counties** – Establish or alter regulatory and construction speed zones on various sections of highways in the state (MO)

This minute order establishes or alters regulatory and construction speed zones on various sections of highways in the state.
