HUB SUBCONTRACTING PLAN

1. Introduction

TxDOT is committed to promoting full and equal business opportunities for businesses in state contracting in accordance with the goals specified in the State of Texas Disparity Study. TxDOT encourages the use of Historically Underutilized Businesses (HUBs) through race, ethnic and gender-neutral means.

Pursuant to <u>Texas Government Code §2161.181</u> and <u>§2161.182</u>, and TxDOT's HUB policy and rules, TxDOT is required to make a good faith effort to increase HUB participation in its contracts. TxDOT may accomplish the goal of increased HUB participation by contracting directly with HUBs or indirectly through subcontracting opportunities.

2. TxDOT's Administrative Rules

TxDOT has adopted the CPA's HUB rules as its own. TxDOT's HUB rules are located in <u>Title 43, Chapter 9, Subchapter L</u> of the Texas Administrative Code, and the CPA rules are located in <u>Title 34, Part 1, Chapter 20, Subchapter B</u>. If there are any discrepancies between TxDOT's administrative rules and this RFP, the rules shall take priority.

3. HUB Participation Goal

The CPA has established statewide HUB participation goals for different categories of contracts in <u>34 T.A.C. §20.13</u>. The classification applicable for the portion of the Work performed under the Design-Build Agreement consisting of Professional Services has a HUB Annual Procurement Utilization Goal of 23.7% per fiscal year. In order to meet or exceed the HUB participation goals, TxDOT encourages outreach to certified HUBs. Proposers shall make a good faith effort to include certified HUBs in the procurement process.

4. Required HUB Subcontracting Plan

TxDOT has determined that subcontracting opportunities are probable for this RFP. As a result, each Proposer must submit an HUB Subcontracting Plan (HSP) with its Proposal. The HSP is required whether a Proposer intends to subcontract or not.

In the HSP, a Proposer must indicate whether it is a Texas certified HUB. Being a certified HUB does not exempt a Proposer from completing the HSP requirement.

5. CPA Centralized Master Bidder's List

Proposers may search for HUB subcontractors in the CPA's Centralized Master Bidders List (CMBL) HUB Directory, which is located on the CPA's website at <u>http://www2.cpa.state.tx.us/cmbl/cmblhub.html</u>. For this procurement, TxDOT has identified the following class and item codes for potential subcontracting opportunities: NIGP Class/Item Code:

- 906-57: Development and Planning, Land (Architectural)
- 925-61: Development and Planning, Land (Engineering)
- 926-72: Environmental Planning and Advisory Services
- 961-44: Planning and Development, Industrial
- 925-86: Professional Land Surveying Services
- 992-26: Biological Testing Services
- 918-10: Air Pollution Consulting
- 906-64: State Urban Planning (Architectural)
- 918-92: Urban Planning Consulting
- 958-16: Planning Services, Soil and Land

Proposers are not required to use, nor limited to using, the class and item codes identified above, and may identify other areas for subcontracting.

TxDOT does not endorse, recommend or attest to the capabilities of any company or individual listed on the CPA's CMBL. The list of certified HUBs is subject to change, so Proposers are encouraged to refer to the CMBL often to find the most current listing of HUBs.

6. HUB Subcontracting Procedures – If a Proposer Intends to Subcontract

An HSP must demonstrate that the Proposer made a good faith effort to comply with TxDOT's HUB policies and procedures. The following subparts outline the items that TxDOT will review in determining whether an HSP meets the good faith effort standard. A Proposer that intends to subcontract must complete the HSP to document its good faith efforts.

a. Identify Subcontracting Areas and Divide Them into Reasonable Lots

A Proposer should first identify each area of the Work it intends to subcontract. Then, to maximize HUB participation, it should divide the Work into reasonable lots or portions, to the extent consistent with prudent industry practices.

b. Notify Potential HUB Subcontractors

The HSP must demonstrate that the Proposer made a good faith effort to subcontract with HUBs. The Proposer's good faith efforts shall be shown through utilization of all methods in conformance with the development and submission of the HSP and by complying with the following steps:

- i. Divide the Work into reasonable lots or portions to the extent consistent with prudent industry practices. The Proposer must determine which portions of Work, including goods and services, will be subcontracted.
- ii. Use the appropriate method(s) to demonstrate good faith effort. The Proposer can use either method(s) 1, 2, 3, or 4:

c. Method 1: Proposer Intends to Subcontract with only HUBs:

The Proposer must identify in the HSP the HUBs that will be utilized and submit written documentation that confirms <u>100%</u> of all available subcontracting opportunities will be performed by one or more HUBs; <u>or</u>,

d. Method 2: Proposer Intends to Subcontract with HUB Protégé(s):

The Proposer must identify in the HSP the HUB protégé(s) that will be utilized and should:

- Include a fully executed copy of the Mentor Protégé Agreement, which must be registered with the CPA prior to submission to TxDOT, and
- Identify areas of the HSP that will be performed by the protégé.

TxDOT will accept a Mentor Protégé Agreement that has been entered into by a Proposer (mentor) and a certified HUB (protégé) in accordance with <u>Texas</u> <u>Government Code §2161.065</u>. When a Proposer proposes to subcontract with a protégé(s), it does not need to provide notice to three (3) HUB vendors for that subcontracted area.

Participation in the Mentor Protégé Program, along with the submission of a protégé as a subcontractor in an HSP, constitutes a good faith effort for the particular area subcontracted to the protégé; **or**,

e. Method 3: Proposer Intends to Subcontract with HUBs and Non-HUBs (Meet or Exceed the Goal):

The Proposer must identify in the HSP and submit written documentation that one or more HUB subcontractors will be utilized; and that the aggregate expected percentage of subcontracts with HUBs will meet or exceed the goal specified in the ITP. When utilizing this method, only HUB subcontractors that have existing contracts with the Proposer for five years or less may be used to comply with the good faith effort requirements.

When the aggregate expected percentage of subcontracts with HUBs meets or exceeds the goal specified in this solicitation, Proposers may also use non-HUB subcontractors; **or**,

- f. Method 4: Proposer Intends to Subcontract with HUBs and Non-HUBs (Does Not Meet or Exceed the Goal): The Proposer must identify in the HSP and submit documentation regarding both of the following requirements:
 - written notification to minority or women trade organizations or development centers to assist in identifying potential HUBs of the subcontracting opportunities the Proposer intends to subcontract.

Proposers must give minority or women trade organizations or development centers at least seven (7) working days prior to submission of the Proposer's

response for dissemination of the subcontracting opportunities to their members. A list of minority and women trade organizations is located on the CPA's website under the <u>Minority and Women Organization link</u>.

- written notification to at least three (3) HUB businesses of the subcontracting opportunities that the Proposer intends to subcontract. The written notice must be sent to potential HUB subcontractors prior to submitting proposals and must include:
 - \circ a description of the scope of work to be subcontracted,
 - \circ information regarding the location to review project plans or specifications,
 - \circ information about bonding and insurance requirements,
 - \circ $\;$ required qualifications and other contract requirements, and
 - \circ $\,$ a description of how the subcontractor can contact the Proposer.

Proposers must give potential HUB subcontractors a reasonable amount of time to respond to the notice, at least seven (7) working days prior to submission of the Proposer's response unless circumstances require a different time period, which is determined by the agency and documented in the contract file;

Proposers must also use the CMBL, the HUB Directory, and Internet resources when searching for HUB subcontractors. Proposers may rely on the services of contractor groups; local, state and federal business assistance offices; and other organizations that provide assistance in identifying qualified applicants for the HUB program.

g. Written Justification of the Selection Process

TxDOT will make a determination if a good faith effort was made by the Proposer in the development of the required HSP. One or more of the methods identified in the previous sections may be applicable to the Proposer's good faith efforts in developing and submission of the HSP. TxDOT may require the Proposer to submit additional documentation explaining how the Proposer made a good faith effort in accordance with the solicitation.

A Proposer must provide written justification of its selection process if it chooses a non-HUB subcontractor. The justification should demonstrate that the Proposer negotiated in good faith with qualified HUB bidders, and did not reject qualified HUBs who were the best value responsive bidders.

7. Method 5: Proposer Does Not Intend to Subcontract

When the Proposer plans to complete all DBA requirements with its own equipment, supplies, materials and/or employees, it is still required to complete an HSP.

The Proposer must complete the "Self Performance Justification" portion of the HSP, and attest that it does not intend to subcontract for any goods or services, including the class and item codes identified in Section I.3.5. In addition, the Proposer must identify

the sections of the proposal that describe how it will complete the Work using its own resources or provide a statement explaining how it will complete the Work using its own resources. The Proposer must agree to comply with the following if requested by TxDOT:

- provide evidence of sufficient Proposer staffing to meet the DBA requirements,
- provide monthly payroll records showing the Proposer staff fully dedicated to the DBA,
- allow TxDOT to conduct an onsite review of company headquarters or work site where services are to be performed, and,
- provide documentation proving employment of qualified personnel holding the necessary licenses and certificates required to perform the Work.

8. Post-award HSP Requirements

The HSP shall be reviewed and evaluated prior to DBA award and, if accepted, the finalized HSP will become part of the DBA with the successful Proposer.

After DBA award, TxDOT will coordinate a post-award meeting with the successful Proposer to discuss HSP reporting requirements. The DB Contractor must maintain business records documenting compliance with the HSP, and must submit monthly subcontract reports to TxDOT by completing the HUB "Prime Contractor Progress Assessment Report." This monthly report is required as a condition for payment to report to the agency the identity and the amount paid to all subcontractors.

As a condition of award the DB Contractor is required to send notification to all selected subcontractors as identified in the accepted/approved HSP. In addition, a copy of the notification must be provided to TxDOT's Project Manager and/or HUB Program Office within 10 days of the DBA award.

During the term of the DBA, if the parties amend the DBA to include a change to the scope of work or add additional funding, TxDOT will evaluate to determine the probability of additional subcontracting opportunities. When applicable, the Contractor must submit an HSP change request for TxDOT's review. The requirements for an HSP change request will be covered in the post-award meeting.

When making a change to an HSP, the DB Contractor will obtain prior written approval from TxDOT before making any changes to the HSP. Proposed changes must comply with the HUB Program good faith effort requirements relating to the development and submission of a HSP.

If the DB Contractor decides to subcontract any part of the Work after DBA award, it must follow the good faith effort procedures outlined in Section 6 above(e.g., divide work into reasonable lots, notify at least three (3) vendors per subcontracted area, provide written justification of the selection process, or participate in the Mentor Protégé Program).

For this reason, TxDOT encourages Proposers to identify, as part of their HSP, multiple subcontractors who are able to perform the Work in each area the Proposer plans to subcontract. Selecting additional subcontractors may help the DB Contractor make

changes to its original HSP, when needed, and will allow TxDOT to approve any necessary changes expeditiously.

Failure to meet the HSP and post-award requirements will constitute a breach of the DBA, and will be subject to remedial actions. TxDOT may also report noncompliance to the CPA in accordance with the provisions of the Vendor Performance and Debarment Program (see 34 T.A.C. §20.108 relating to Debarment) and (see 34 T.A.C. §20.105 relating to Procedures for Investigations and Debarment).

The HUB Program promotes equal business opportunities for economically disadvantaged persons to contract with the State of Texas in accordance with the goals specified in the 2009 State of Texas Disparity Study. The statewide HUB goals defined in 34 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) §20.13 are:

- 11.2 percent for heavy construction other than building contracts,
- 21.1 percent for all building construction, including general contractors and operative builders' contracts,
- 32.9 percent for all special trade construction contracts,
- 23.7 percent for professional services contracts,
- 26.0 percent for all other services contracts, and
- 21.1 percent for commodities contracts.

- - Agency Special Instructions/Additional Requirements - -

In accordance with 34 TAC §20.14(d)(1)(D)(iii), a respondent (prime contractor) may demonstrate good faith effort to utilize Texas certified HUBs for its subcontracting opportunities if the total value of the respondent's subcontracts with Texas certified HUBs meets or exceeds the statewide HUB goal or the agency specific HUB goal, whichever is higher. When a respondent uses this method to demonstrate good faith effort, the respondent must identify the HUBs with which it will subcontract. - The respondent must seek approval from the contracting agency prior to making any modifications to its HSP, including the hiring of additional or different subcontractors and the termination of a subcontractor the respondent identified in its HSP. If the HSP is modified without the contracting agency's prior approval, respondent may be subject to any and all enforcement remedies available under the contract or otherwise available by law, up to and including debarment from all state contracting.
