The Tyler District plans, designs, builds, operates and maintains the state transportation system in the following counties: Anderson, Cherokee, Gregg, Henderson, Rusk, Smith, Van Zandt and Wood. The district primarily conducts asset preservation and mobility projects to ensure the safety of the traveling public.



The Tyler District has 1,198 On-System bridges and 637 Off-System bridges, for a total of 1,835 bridges.

- FM 2206 Phase 1, Gregg County: Widen to 4 lanes from Loop 281 to Fisher Road \$15 million (Anticipated Completion Date: Spring 2024)

- SH 198, Henderson County: Construct bridge replacement - \$30.4 million (Anticipated Completion Date: Fall 2024)
- FM 2493, Smith County: Widen to 4 lanes from FM 346 in Flint to Cherokee County Line south of Bullard \$50 million (Anticipated Completion Date: Spring 2027)
- US 69/FM 2493 Interchange and Realign FM 2493: Includes grade-separated interchange realign of FM 2493, west of US 69 – \$49 million (Anticipated Completion Date: Summer 2027)

- US 175, Cherokee County: Widen to 4 lanes from CR 3509 to Jacksonville – \$150 million (Letting: June 2023)
- I-20/SH 31 Interchange, Gregg County: Remove left exits, reconfigure interchange – \$170 million (Letting: June 2025)
- U S 271, Gregg & Smith counties: Widen to 4 lanes from FM 16 to Loop 485 in Gladewater – \$64 million (Letting: December 2024)
- FM 2493, Cherokee County: Widen to 4 lanes from Cherokee County line to US 69 with overpass at US 69. - \$53 million (Letting: May 2023)

MAINTENANCE: The Tyler District spends approximately \$15 million annually on sealcoating projects. We also spend several million each year rehabilitating pavement on our interstate and US highway system.

CORRIDORS: The district's priority corridors are I-20, US 69, US 79, US 175 and SH 31.

SAFETY: The district has pursued funding for numerous safety improvement projects, including grade separations, widening of narrow roadways, adding center- and edge-line rumble strips and overlaying roadways with surface mixes that reduce wet weather accidents.
