MAINTENANCE: We spend approximately \$153 million annually for preventive, routine and rehabilitative maintenance.

SAFETY: Our current and upcoming safety projects include 49 miles of added shoulders along rural roadways in the Erath, Johnson, Palo Pinto and Wise counties for approximately \$70 million.
