
Ports-to-Plains System in Texas: Future Interstate Sections (FIS)



The Ports-to-Plains Corridor was divided into 13 Future Interstate Sections (FIS)

- Each section was identified with logical end points to meet federal requirements for advancing through environmental clearance
- Future Interstate Sections are identified on the map using the existing control-section numbers
- Three Future Interstate Sections are interstates
 - I-27, I-20, and I-35

- Study/implementation plan completed in 2022



Northern Relief Route connection – Authorized to proceed with environmental clearance, schematic development and ROW determination. Work is contracted, scoping discussions underway. Active project development to commence this summer.




 Expansion of US 277 to freeway standards – ROW acquisition underway, PS&E development at 30%.
 Scheduled for FY 2026 letting, estimated at \$51 million.




US 87 southern segment – Partially funded in 2024 UTP. SJT, in conjunction with SAMPO, is seeking to repurpose Cat. 12 funds allocated here to northern relief route segment in 2025 UTP, while seeking SWDA to proceed with schematic development, environmental clearance and ROW determination here.

Sonora Safety Route



- SJT has worked with Sutton County and Sonora to develop a relief route for US 277.
- Dubbed the "Sonora Safety Route" by County Judge Steve Smith, SJT conducted a feasibility study for a Ports-to-Plains and future Interstate corridor with the County's support, culminating in the preferred alternative shown here. This study was completed and delivered in FY 2021.
- SJT has listed this as a candidate project for SWDA consideration in the FY 2025 UTP cycle. This authority would allow us to proceed with schematic development, ROW determination and environmental clearance.




