# 1 TECHNICAL DOCUMENTS

## 1.1 General Requirements

- a. Following is a list of certain Technical Documents that are incorporated into the CDA Documents in addition to the Technical Documents identified in Book 2.
- b. When a Technical Document refers to an activity that “must,” “shall” or “should” be done or “is” done, those activities are mandatory for the Developer to perform.
- c. All references in a Technical Document to “should” shall mean “shall”.
- d. When a Technical Document refers to the “Engineer”, "Consultant", "Consultant engineer", "TxDOT personnel", “District personnel” or “District” it shall mean Developer, to the extent applicable, as determined by TxDOT in TxDOT’s sole discretion.
- e. Provisions in the Technical Documents that provide general information (e.g., descriptions of TxDOT procedures), but that are not applicable to CDAs have not been changed. In some cases however, it may not be clear whether rights or responsibilities described in the provisions are applicable to the Developer. If it is unclear whether specific provisions in the Technical Document are applicable to Developer, the Developer shall request clarification from TxDOT and TxDOT shall provide clarification in its sole discretion.
- f. For the edition and/or version of the Technical Document that applies, refer to Sections 7.2.5 and 8.1.2 of the Agreement.
- g. In the case of conflicting provisions, refer to Section 1.2 of the Agreement, for order of precedence.
- h. The Developer may apply for Deviations from Technical Documents, in accordance with Section 14 of the Agreement.
