

Border West Expressway (Loop 375) Project

Project Information

Regional mobility studies identified the need for an alternate route to provide congestion relief in the region. One of the key solutions that will help regional mobility is the completion of Loop 375 in El Paso, Texas.

The proposed Loop 375 Border Highway West Extension Project will provide:

- Better connectivity around the city
- Additional infrastructure to accommodate future growth
- Congestion relief
- Improved access to the university, downtown, and medical centers
- Better incident management and a safer roadway

Improvements

The \$448 million project begins at Racetrack Drive near Doniphan Road and extends to approximately one mile east of Park Street, near downtown. Improvements include construction of a new four-lane controlled access toll facility that connects Loop 375 to US 85.

All existing non-tolled lanes will remain non-tolled; only newly-constructed lanes will be tolled.

Schedule (subject to change)

- Final RFP issued December 2013
- Contract conditionally awarded April 2014
- Construction to begin early 2015
- Construction expected to be complete by early 2018
