4. Contracts

Consider the award or rejection of contracts for highway construction and maintenance, and construction and rehabilitation of buildings (Presentation)

These proposed minute orders contain information concerning the receipt of bids for highway improvement contracts. The Texas Department of Transportation may reschedule receipt of bids for those projects where the Texas Transportation Commission (commission) rejects all bids. Those bids accepted by the commission will result in conditional contract awards to the low bidders. Contract award conditions may involve securing funding from other sources, the contractor's ability to satisfy federal DBE subcontracting requirements, or other requirements as outlined in the project bid proposal.

6. **Public Transportation**

Various Counties - Consider the award of federal and state funds to multiple entities for a variety of program-eligible purposes (MO)

The awards identified in this minute order reflect the allocation of federal Section 5304 funds to designated lead planning agencies and the allocation of state, federal Section 5311, and federal Section 5339 funds to various entities due to changes in transit district boundaries.

7. State Infrastructure Bank

Bowie County - Consider final approval of a request from the city of Texarkana for a State Infrastructure Bank loan in the amount of up to \$1,408,000 for the costs of utility relocation necessary for a non-tolled, on-system project to widen US 82 in Bowie County, Texas (<u>Presentation</u>) (<u>MO</u>)

The city of Texarkana (city) will secure the loan with a pledge of water and sewer revenues. The loan will be used to pay the city's costs of utility relocation necessary for non-tolled, on-system project to widen US 82 in Bowie County, Texas.

8. Contested Case

Travis County - CityLynx, Inc. v. Texas Department of Transportation - Consider action on proposal for decision by an administrative law judge concerning Texas Department of Transportation's decision to debar CityLynx, Inc. for a period of 15 months, final order with an effective date in 2025 for ethical violations (MO)

The executive director issued an order on December 27, 2023, sanctioning CityLynx, Inc. with a 30-month debarment (no immediate suspension was issued), disqualifying CityLynx, Inc. from entering into contracts, participating as a subcontractor, or participating as a supplier of materials. CityLynx, Inc. appealed the decision and on March 5, 2025, the State Office of Administrative Hearings issued a proposal for decision recommending a 15-month debarment, finding the then Vice President of CityLynx, Inc. made false or misleading statements regarding an employee's electrical certification, violating Texas Department of Transportation's rules of ethical conduct.

9. Eminent Domain Proceedings

Various Counties - Consider the authorization of the filing of condemnation proceedings to acquire real property by eminent domain for non-controlled and controlled access highways (see attached itemized list) (MO)

Texas Transportation Commission findings, determinations, and authorizations for the state, by motion made in accordance with Senate Bill 18 (82nd Legislature), to acquire by eminent domain, upon the payment of adequate and just compensation, various ownership interests in specific parcels of real property that are needed to develop or improve both non-controlled and controlled access state highways, to include requesting the state attorney general to bring and pursue condemnation suits relating to those specific parcels of real property described in the attached itemized list.

10. Routine Minute Orders and Reports

a. **Donations to the Department**

Various Districts - Consider the acknowledgment of donations with a value of \$500 or more, including donations of money, materials, services, or real property, that are made to the Texas Department of Transportation (department) for the purpose of assisting the department in carrying out its functions and duties or for improving access to or from a highway on the state highway system (see attached itemized list) (MO)

State statutes require the Texas Transportation Commission (commission) to acknowledge the acceptance of a gift to the Texas Department of Transportation that is valued at \$500 or more. By the adoption of this minute order, the commission acknowledges the receipt and acceptance of the property specified in the minute order.

10. Routine Minute Orders and Reports (continued)

b. Real Estate Dispositions

The Texas Transportation Commission must approve the sales, transfers, and exchanges of state rights of way and other real properties that are no longer needed for a state highway purpose. It must also approve, accept, and acknowledge donations to the state of real property that is valued at \$500 or more.

- (1) **Eastland County** I-20 Consider the sale of right of way to the city of Eastland, Texas (MO)

 The district has determined that the land is no longer needed for highway purposes. The city of Eastland has requested to purchase the land, and it may be sold to the city.
- (2) Fort Bend County FM 359 Consider the removal from the system and exchange of highway right of way easements as part of a transaction to acquire a fee simple interest in highway right of way needed for a state highway purpose (MO)

The district has determined that a segment of roadway is no longer needed as part of the system and the highway easements to be conveyed by the state in the exchange are no longer needed for a state highway purpose. The governor, on the recommendation of the Texas Transportation Commission, may execute a deed exchanging an interest in real property acquired but not needed for a highway purpose as whole or partial consideration for another interest in real property needed for a state highway purpose.

- (3) **Hill County** I-35W Consider the sale of right of way to an abutting landowner (MO)
 - The district has determined that the land is no longer needed for highway purposes. An abutting landowner has requested to purchase the land, and it may be sold to the requester.
- (4) **Palo Pinto County** FM 4 Consider the removal from the system and sale of right of way to the Palo Pinto County Municipal Water District No. 1 (MO)
 - The district has determined that the land is no longer needed for highway purposes. The Palo Pinto County Municipal Water District (water district) has requested to purchase the land, and it may be sold to the water district.
- (5) **Reeves County** I-20B Consider the sale of real property to the town of Pecos City, Texas (MO)

The district has determined that the land is no longer needed for highway purposes. The town of Pecos City (town) has requested to purchase the land, and it may be sold to the town.

10. Routine Minute Orders and Reports (continued)

c. Reports

(1) Compliance Division Report

State law requires the Texas Transportation Commission (commission) to establish a compliance program, which must include a Compliance Division to oversee the program. The Compliance Division is responsible for acting to prevent and detect serious breaches of Texas Department of Transportation (department) policy, fraud, waste, and abuse of office, including any acts of criminal conduct within the department. The Compliance Division is required to provide a monthly report to the commission regarding investigations and a summary of information relating to trends and recommendations.

(2) Quarterly Investment Report

Quarterly Investment Report for all funds invested at the direction of the Texas Transportation Commission (Report)

This is the quarterly investment report for the investment of: (1) funds held by the Bank of New York Mellon, as trustee, under the Indenture of Trust securing the Central Texas Turnpike System toll revenue obligations; (2) funds for the custodial accounts under the Master Lockbox and Custodial Account Agreement held by the Bank of New York Mellon, acting as custodian; (3) funds held by Amegy Bank, a Division of ZB, National Association, as trustee, under the Trust Agreement securing the I-35E Managed Lanes Project toll revenue obligations; and (4) funds held by U.S. Bank National Association, as trustee, under the Master Trust Agreement securing the SH 249 System toll revenue obligations.

d. **Transportation Planning**

(1) SH 121 - Various Counties - Consider concurrence with the Regional Transportation Council of the North Central Texas Council of Governments' funding of construction and other project development costs of projects to be advanced through the use of payments received from the North Texas Tollway Authority in accordance with the SH 121 Toll Project Agreement (MO)

The Texas Department of Transportation has established a separate fund to account for and track projects and project costs funded with the SH 121 payments. This minute order authorizes the funding of additional project costs and changes to the list of previously approved projects. The project costs to be funded were selected through a cooperative process with the Regional Transportation Council.

- d. Transportation Planning
 - (2) **SH 161 Various Counties** Consider concurrence with the Regional Transportation Council of the North Central Texas Council of Governments' funding of construction and other project development costs of projects to be advanced through the use of payments received from the North Texas Tollway Authority in accordance with the SH 161 Toll Project Agreement (MO)

The Texas Department of Transportation has established a separate fund to account for and track projects and project costs funded with the SH 161 payments. This minute order authorizes the funding of additional project costs and changes to the list of previously approved projects. The project costs to be funded were selected through a cooperative process with the Regional Transportation Council.

e. **Speed Zones**

Various Counties - Consider the establishment or alteration of regulatory and construction speed zones on various sections of highways in the state (MO) This minute order establishes or alters regulatory and construction speed zones on various sections of highways in the state.
