Minute Order

VARIOUS Counties, ALL Districts

The Texas Transportation Commission (commission) desires to award a total of \$107,966,561 in state and Federal Transit Administration (FTA) program funds to support a variety of public transportation needs in rural and urban areas of the state.

Of the amounts appropriated to the Texas Department of Transportation (department) by the General Appropriations Act of the 89th Texas Legislature, Regular Session, \$73,752,134 was appropriated for urban and rural public transportation systems for the 2026-2027 biennium and \$12,000,000 was appropriated for rural public transportation service expansion projects. Title 43, Texas Administrative Code (TAC), §31.11 establishes a process by which state public transportation funds shall be distributed to the large urban, small urban, and rural areas of the state.

An award of \$36,876,067 of fiscal year (FY) 2027 state funds to the transit district(s) serving the large and small urbanized areas and to rural transit districts and \$12,000,000 of FY 2026 and 2027 state funds to rural transit districts for a total of \$48,876,067 is shown in Exhibit A and has been determined in accordance with §31.11.

Title 43, TAC, §31.36(f) establishes a formula by which public transportation funds shall be distributed under the FTA Formula Grants for Rural Areas program 49 United States Code (U.S.C.) §5311. An award of \$50,976,534 of federal §5311 funds is shown in Exhibit B and has been determined in accordance with §31.36(f).

Title 43, TAC, §31.30(e)(1) establishes a formula by which public transportation funds shall be distributed under the FTA Bus and Bus Facilities

Formula Grant program (49 U.S.C. §5339). An award of \$8,113,960 in federal FY 2025 and 2026 §5339 funds and residual funds from prior years is shown in Exhibit C and has been determined in accordance with §31.30(e)(1).

Transportation Code, Chapter 455 assigns a broad spectrum of public transportation roles and missions to the department.

Transportation Code, Chapter 456 authorizes the commission to administer funds appropriated for public transportation.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the commission that the executive director or the director's designee is directed to proceed with the awards in exhibits A through C, submit the necessary state application to the FTA, and enter into the necessary contracts.
