PLANNED MAJOR PROJECTS:

- IH 45 Widening to 6 lanes through Huntsville north of SH 30 - \$240 million
- SH 21 Widening in Madison County - \$120 million
- SH 6 Widening in Bryan/College Station - \$260 million
- US 79 Widening in Leon County - \$100 million
- SH 6 Widening from Brazos County to Hearne - \$160 million
- US 290/SH 36 Interchange in Brenham - \$100 million

SAFETY: The Bryan District's number one priority is safety. We are committed to reducing traffic fatalities by focusing on engineering and education.

BRIDGES: We have 1120 On-System bridges and 643 off-system bridges. For a total of 1863 Bridges.

MAINTENANCE: We invest approximately \$100 million annually on maintaining our system. This includes pavement, signing, striping, and drainage.
