MAINTENANCE: The Corpus Christi district has a regular maintenance budget of \$57.6 million. The district anticipates spending \$11 million on seal coat projects in FY 2025.

CORRIDORS: Priority corridors include I-69/US 77, I-37, US 59, US 281, US 181, US 183, SH 72 and SH 361

SAFETY: The district aggressively addresses system safety by providing wider shoulders, adding centerline and edge line rumble strips, adding passing lanes, constructing cable barriers on divided highways and installing traffic signals and illumination at intersections.
