**WORK ZONE SAFETY IN NATIONAL SPOTLIGHT APRIL 15-19** 



### As the last bit of winter

makes way for warmer spring and summer temps, work zone activities will be on the rise

across Texas. To help remind drivers about staying safe in these areas, the National Work Zone Awareness Week is scheduled for April 15-19 this year.

In looking at the top reasons for work zone crashes in the Dallas District, the top three contributing factors accounted for nearly 75% of the total reports last year: speeding, distracted driving and unsafe lane movements/failure to yield. Various other factors include intoxicated driving, following too close and unsafe lane changes in the work zone.

**The TxDOT Dallas District** will be sharing safety tips on social media each day addressing these factors during the awareness week. Be on the lookout for these on Twitter/X, Facebook, Instagram and NextDoor and share with your family and friends.

Training Day. Go over simple safety reminders and schedule an extra discussion with your crews for safety demonstrations or discussions on prevention steps or safety policies.






#### **SOLAR ECLIPSE: APRIL 8, 2024\***

In downtown Dallas, partial eclipse will **start at 12:23 PM**, with **TOTAL ECLIPSE BEGINNING AT 1:44 PM**.

The maximum duration of totality will be approximately

3 MIN, 51 SEC. The partial eclipse will **end at 3:02 PM**.



#### PROTECT YOUR EYES

IT IS NOT SAFE to observe the solar eclipse with unprotected eyes. Regular sunglasses are NOT the same and do not provide an equal level of protection as solar viewing glasses.



#### MAINTAIN AWARENESS

BE AWARE of your surroundings especially while driving. Heavy traffic may be present in some areas creating additional hazards with vehicles suddenly stopping or driving erratically.





#### PLAN FOR CONGESTION

#### **EXPECT HEAVIER-THAN-USUAL TRAFFIC**

in the days before, during and after the eclipse, especially on major corridors near the path of totality.





#### **EARLY BIRD GETS THE VIEWS**

#### LEAVE EARLY AND PLAN YOUR ROUTE.

Your drive may take longer than predicted.

DriveTexas.org has up-to-date traffic conditions.

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#### BE A CONSIDERATE OBSERVER

**FIND A SAFE, DESIGNATED SPACE** to park before the eclipse. **DO NOT STOP** in the middle of the road or on the road shoulder.

\*An unobscured view of the eclipse will be dependent upon local weather conditions on April 8.
