KEY PROJECTS UNDERWAY:

- **I-45 South*:** widening from FM 517 to FM 1764 — \$230 million
 - Anticipated completion: Early 2025
- **I-45 South*:** widening from FM 1764 to FM 519 — \$166 million
 - Anticipated completion: Mid 2026
- **I-45 South*:** widening from FM 519 to Texas City Wye — \$226 million
 - Anticipated completion: Summer 2028
- **I-45 South*:** widening from Texas City Wye to N of Galveston Causeway to FM 519 — \$103 million
 - Anticipated completion: Summer 2027
- **I-610 South Loop.:** reconstruct mainlanes and frontage roads; addition of freeway overpass and 8 direct connectors to SH 288 — \$117 million
 - Anticipated completion: Early 2025
- **SH-35*:** widening from Griggs Road to I-45/Spur 5 — \$94 million
 - Anticipated completion: Late 2025
- **SH-146:** reconstruct and widening from FM 518 to Dickinson Bayou — \$198 million
 - Anticipated completion: Mid 2027
- **I-10 West*:** widening from FM 359 to Brazos River project cost \$195 million
 - Anticipated completion: Early 2025
- **US 59/I-69 South:** widening from FM 762 to Spur 10 — \$135 million
 - Anticipated completion: Winter 2023, (includes additional year of frontage road reconstruction)
- **I-45 NHHIP*:** from downtown to Beltway 8 North
 - \$4.12 billion of committed funding
 - Record of Decision issued February 2021
 - Anticipated build will consist of 14 independent projects
 - Memorandum of Understanding reached with Harris County; lawsuit dismissed
 - Memorandum of Understanding reached with the City of Houston resolving city's project concerns
 - Federal pause lifted by Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) with execution of Voluntary Resolution Agreement between TxDOT and FHWA
- **I-10 at White Oak:** elevating the existing I-10 mainlanes above the floodplain of White Oak Bayou from Heights Blvd to I-45; includes construction of a detention pond and shared use path, both on the north side of I-10.
 - Anticipated completion: June 2028

MAINTENANCE: The district spent \$260 million in FY 2024 on preventive and routine maintenance.

CORRIDORS: The district's major thoroughfares include I-610 Loop, I-10, I-45, SH 288, SH 6, SH 225, SH 146, US 59/I-69, US 290, US 90, SH 99 and Beltway 8.

SAFETY: Safety is priority number one! Over the last four years the Houston District has allocated over \$80.8 million for highway safety enhancement (HSE) projects.
