Shepherd to Trinity Upgrade Public Meeting

TxDOT conducted a public meeting on April 27 for proposed improvements to US 59 from Shepherd to the Trinity River that will upgrade this section of roadway to meet interstate standards.



A large group gathered at the Shepherd High School Cafeteria to view the proposed schematics. Most took the opportunity to speak to TxDOT officials and leave comments and suggestions.

TxDOT is proposing improvements to US 59 that will include the construction of two-lane northbound and southbound frontage roads, the reconstruction of US 59 main lanes, the construction/replacement of the Trinity River Bridges with turnarounds, and an overpass with turnarounds at FM 1127. The

project is planned from approximately 0.2 miles north of FM 223 (Church Street) to north of the Trinity River in San Jacinto and Polk counties.

The 6-mile project is designed to enhance safety, improve mobility, provide a more efficient hurricane evacuation route, and provide system connectivity to Interstate 69. Schematic and environmental studies will be done through 2024, with right of way acquisitions and utility relocations tentatively scheduled for 2025-2028.



Lufkin District Accessibility Program

Since 2018 the Lufkin District has completed construction or design of more than 25 miles of Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) compliant sidewalk along on-system roadways, not including pedestrian infrastructure incorporated in highway projects. One of the major goals of the Lufkin District is to ensure **everyone** gets home safely.

District ADA projects are under development in Lufkin, Zavalla, and Nacogdoches which will let for construction in 2024. These projects are the result of specific needs presented by and discussed with public and elected officials, school districts, and internal review of locations throughout the District. The Lufkin District is continuing to identify ADA projects within the District that will ultimately provide safe alternative routes for pedestrian traffic. If you see a need for ADA compliant sidewalks in your community, let us know.

Transportation Alternatives Program Call

TxDOT is announcing the Transportation Alternatives (TA) 2023 program call for projects for bicycle and pedestrian infrastructure. Through this competitive call for projects, TxDOT intends to identify projects for available non-urban TA funds and future anticipated TA funds for non-urban and small urban communities. The program call was opened on December 2, 2022.

Program Status:

Preliminary Applications were accepted on January 27, 2023. A total of 16 applications were submitted in the Lufkin District with 7 sponsors (Cities of Lufkin, Center, Coldspring, Crockett, Grapeland, Huntington, and Nacogdoches):

- Detailed Applications are due: June 5, 2023
- TxDOT Detailed Application review deadline: August 18, 2023
- Commission Awards: October 2023

"People on motorcycles are more vulnerable on our roadways," said TxDOT Executive Director Marc Williams. "It's important for drivers to pay extra attention and look out for motorcycles — especially at intersections, when turning in front of oncoming traffic and while changing lanes. We all want to get home safe."

TxDOT's "Share the Road: Look Twice for Motorcycles" campaign is a key component of #EndTheStreakTX, a broader social media and word-of-mouth effort that encourages drivers to make safer choices while behind the wheel to help end the streak of daily deaths. Nov. 7, 2000, was the last deathless day on Texas roadways.




Driven by Texans

- <u>US 59/SL 224 South Interchange</u> project involves upgrading existing US 59 by constructing new US 59 direct connectors at SL 224(S) and frontage roads along SL 224 between SH 7 and US 59. Construction began in September 2019 and is anticipated to be complete Summer 2024.
- <u>US 59 Diboll Relief Route</u> project involves constructing a new location controlled access roadway east of Diboll. Construction began in Spring 2020 and is anticipated to be complete late 2025.
- <u>US 59 Upgrade Moffett Rd to SH 103</u> this project in Lufkin involves upgrading existing US 59 to a controlled access roadway by adding frontage roads. Construction began in 2021 and scheduled for completion in Fall 2023.
- <u>US 59 Upgrade Redland</u> project involves upgrading existing US 59 to a controlled access roadway by adding frontage roads between SL 287 and FM 2021. Construction began in late 2022 and is anticipated to be completed in Fall 2025.
- <u>US 59 Corrigan Relief Route</u> project involves the construction of a new location controlled access roadway west of Corrigan. Utility relocations are finalizing, and construction began in fall 2022. Project is anticipated to be completed in late 2027.
- <u>US 59 Upgrade Shepherd to Cleveland (future I-69)</u> project involves upgrading existing US 59 to a controlled access roadway by adding frontage roads between FM 2914 and SL 573. TxDOT received approval of schematic and environmental studies in August 2019. ROW acquisitions and demolition has begun. Utility relocations have begun. Construction is currently scheduled to begin in late 2023.
- <u>US 59/US 259 NORTH NACOGDOCHES INTERCHANGE</u> this project involves converting existing US 59 to a four-lane controlled access freeway from Stallings Dr. to 1 mile north of US 259. The proposed project would include reconstructing the US 59/US 259 interchange to eliminate the current cloverleaf configuration and adding new frontage roads. TxDOT began field surveying in late 2020. A public meeting was held May 17, 2022, and one is planned for late 2023. Construction is currently scheduled to begin in 2029.
- <u>US 59 Upgrade Shepherd to Trinity River</u> project involves upgrading existing US 59 to a controlled access roadway by adding frontage roads between FM 223 (Church St) to just north of the Trinity River. TxDOT executed a contract to begin schematic and environmental studies in early 2022. TxDOT began field surveying in late 2022. A public meeting was held April 27, 2023. Construction is currently scheduled to begin in 2023.


