#### A Legacy in Progress

It's no secret that TxDOT is family. But in the Lufkin District, that means three generations of the same family who have chosen TxDOT as a career. Betty G. Peavy, daughter Cathy Dunn Loerch, and granddaughter Regina Loerch, have either retired or currently working, all in the Lufkin District. Betty began her career at TxDOT in the San Augustine Maintenance Office as office manager in 1982 and retired in 2004 after serving 22 years. She says she chose TxDOT because she had heard about the great benefits the agency offered. "My career was very beneficial and one that I enjoyed very much," she said. "I made so many lifelong friends throughout my career. I feel that I have a lot invested in TxDOT because of family. TxDOT is a great place to work."

Her daughter, Cathy Dunn Loerch, currently serves as the Design Lead for the district's Central Design section. She began her career as a summer intern in the mid-80's and later worked full time in the Livingston Area Office and the San Augustine office, when it was also an area office, before moving to the District Office in 2013. She has served more than 24 years in the Lufkin District. "I have been very blessed to have found my niche as a roadway designer," she said. "The best thing about the Lufkin District is how much of a family we all are."

Regina grew up hearing about TxDOT. It was a part of their lives. It was natural for her to begin her service as a summer employee in 2014 in high school, continuing from 2015-



19 while enrolled at Stephen F. Austin State University. She is now working full time as an administrative assistant in the TP&D section at the Lufkin District office. "My career at TxDOT so far has been a great experience and very enjoyable," she said. "Being able to be a part of the advanced planning and public involvement team is great."

They each have their own hobbies away from work. Betty loves to work in her flower garden. Cat (as she is known at the office) can be found near the water fishing for catfish, crappie, redfish, or sharks. Regina unwinds by reading, assessing her skills at video games, or spending time with friends.

While they each chose different paths within TxDOT, they all have the same sentiment about the agency. "Before Mom retired, it was nice to be able to ask her how and why things were done a particular way, to learn the ropes. After a while, it was nice to be able to have someone who could appreciate what I do all the time," Cat said. "I am such a workaholic and love helping others, having the chance to explain the TxDOT way to my own daughter is more than I could ask for. It is like passing down the torch by being able to share with my daughter what my mother shared with me."





#### I-69 DEVELOPMENT IN THE LUFKIN DISTRICT



There are currently ten projects that the Lufkin District is actively developing to meet interstate standards. These projects are in varying stages of development from schematic to construction. Below is a brief status on each. - <u>US 59/SL 224 South Interchange</u> project involves upgrading existing US 59 by constructing new US 59 direct connectors at SL 224(S) and frontage roads along SL 224 between SH 7 and US 59. Construction began in September 2019 and is anticipated to be complete fall 2025, weather permitting.
- <u>US 59 Diboll Relief Route</u> project involves constructing a new location controlled-access roadway
  east of Diboll. Construction began in Spring 2020 and is anticipated to be summer 2025, weather
  permitting.
- <u>US 59 Upgrade Moffett Rd to SH 103</u> this project in Lufkin involves upgrading existing US 59 to a controlled access roadway by adding frontage roads. Construction began in 2021 and scheduled for completion in winter 2024, weather permitting.
- <u>US 59 Upgrade Redland</u> project involves upgrading existing US 59 to a controlled access roadway
  by adding frontage roads between SL 287 and FM 2021. Construction began in late 2022 and is
  anticipated to be completed in fall 2025, weather permitting.
- <u>US 59 Corrigan Relief Route</u> project involves the construction of a new location controlled-access roadway, west of Corrigan. Construction began in fall 2022 and is anticipated to be completed in summer 2026, weather permitting.
- <u>US 59 Upgrade Shepherd to Cleveland (future I-69)</u> project involves upgrading existing US 59 to a controlled-access roadway by adding frontage roads between FM 2914 and SL 573. Construction began in winter 2023 and is anticipated to be completed in late winter 2031.
- <u>US 59/US 259 North Nacogdoches Interchange</u> this project involves upgrading US 59 to a controlled-access roadway from Stallings Drive/SL 224 to 1.3 miles north of US 259 by reconstructing the US 59/US 259 interchange and adding new frontage roads. A public meeting was held on Aug. 3, 2023. Construction is currently scheduled to begin in 2029.
- <u>US 59 Upgrade Shepherd to Trinity River</u> project involves upgrading existing US 59 to a controlledaccess roadway by adding frontage roads between FM 223 (Church Street) to just north of the Trinity River. TxDOT held a public meeting on April 27, 2023. Construction is currently scheduled to begin in 2029.
- <u>US 59 Upgrade North Livingston</u> project involves upgrading US 59 to a controlled-access roadway by reconstructing the US 59/US 190 interchange, reconstructing US 59 main lanes and frontage roads from just south of US 190 to SL 116. TxDOT is currently working with a consultant on the development of the schematic. A public meeting is tentatively scheduled in mid-2024. Construction is currently scheduled to begin in 2032.
- <u>US 59 Upgrade South Livingston</u> project involves upgrading US 59 to a controlled-access roadway
  by reconstructing the US 59/FM 1988 interchange, reconstructing US 59 main lanes and adding
  frontage roads from just south of US 190 to 0.39 miles south of FM 1988. TxDOT is currently working
  with a consultant on the development of the schematic. A public meeting is tentatively scheduled in
  mid-2024. This project currently does not have construction funding identified.




