CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES IN YOUR NEIGHBORHOOD

As our crews and trucks work in the area, we're committed to being a good neighbor to nearby property owners and drivers. We understand construction can be tough on everyone, which is why we're doing what we can to minimize impacts and keep you informed.

Businesses, residents and drivers can expect to see and hear a variety of construction activities within the US 183 project limits from RM 1431 to Avery Ranch Boulevard in Williamson County.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

OFTEN: DAILY OR WEEKLY



NOISE: Construction can be loud. We will use noise limiting techniques like ambient backup alarms during night work.



LIGHTS: Construction lighting is needed during night work for crews to perform their job. These lights will be directed away from nearby properties and roadway traffic.



HEAVY MACHINERY: Expect to see big machines like cranes and forklifts in use during construction.



LANE CLOSURES: Lane closures may be needed to safely complete our work. Detour signage will be provided.



DUST: Construction work is dusty. We will strive to keep our dirt at a minimum by using on site sweepers and water trucks.

RARELY: SEVERAL TIMES A MONTH OR LESS



VIBRATION: Activities like drilling, concrete hammering, and excavation may cause vibration. We will monitor these activities to ensure they are at safe levels.



PROPERTY ACCESS IMPACTS: A few properties may experience temporary property access modifications to allow crews to safely perform their work.



WATER SHUT-OFF: A few properties may experience temporary water shut-offs to allow crews to modify and expand water lines under the road.

WORK ZONE SAFETY TIPS

Stay alert and follow signage when driving so everyone gets home safely at the end of the day.

- Slow down and follow posted work zone speed limits.
- Pay attention and put the phone away.
- Don't tailgate.
- Obey road crew flaggers.
- Plan ahead to avoid delays.
