

How to Drive Through a Roundabout:

Always Yield to Circulating Traffic

The “Golden Rule” of roundabouts: YIELD

Drivers entering a roundabout must yield to circulating traffic, pedestrians and bicyclists.

Drivers already in the circle have the right of way. A driver approaching a roundabout must wait for a safe gap in traffic before entering.

- 1 Enter only when there is a safe gap in circulating traffic.
- 2 Yield to pedestrians and bicyclists using crosswalks.
- 3 Yield to all traffic coming from the left.
- 4 The entering driver (red) is incorrect for failing to yield to circulating traffic (blue).

The driver in the inside lane of the roundabout can either continue circulating or exit.

Entering vehicles must yield to all lanes coming from the left.

- 5 Continue to your exit - you should not need to stop within a roundabout.
