Roundabouts

Pedestrians and Bicyclists

Bicyclists on the road

- 1. Choose the proper lane before entering the roundabout.
- 2. Yield to pedestrians in crosswalks and to traffic already in the roundabout.
- 3. Enter the roundabout when there is a safe gap in traffic.
- 4. Stay in your lane and maintain a steady pace.
- 5. Use the middle of the lane to help drivers see you.

Bicyclists on the shared use path

- 1. Dismount your bicycle at the shared use path ramp.
- 2. Walk your bicycle through the roundabout using the crosswalk.
- 3. Follow the rules that apply to pedestrians below.

Pedestrians on the sidewalk

- 1. Approach the crosswalk and pause at the ramp. Look toward approaching traffic.
- 2. Show your intent to cross by standing next to the road and making eye contact with drivers.
- 3. Wait for approaching vehicles to yield, then cross one direction of traffic to the median refuge area. Be aware that drivers in the inside lane (left lane) may not be able to see you as cars in the outside lane (right lane) are yielding at the crosswalk.
- 4. After reaching the median refuge area, repeat this process to cross the other half of the road.
