1 SUBCHAPTER G. OFF-SYSTEM RAIL GRADE SEPARATION STATE FUND 2 PROGRAM 3 4 §7.120 Purpose. This subchapter prescribes the policies and 5 procedures for the implementation and administration of the Off-6 System Rail Grade Separation State Fund Program authorized by 7 Transportation Code, §471.010. 8 9 §7.121 Definitions. The following words and terms, when used in 10 this subchapter, shall have the following meanings, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise. 11 12 (1) Commission--Texas Transportation Commission. 13 (2) Department--Texas Department of Transportation. 14 (3) Director-Director of the department's Railroad 15 Division. 16 (4) Executive director--The executive director of the 17 department or the executive director's designee. 18 (5) Participating railroad--The railroad company that owns 19 or otherwise has control of the railroad at the location of the 20 project. 21 (6) Program--The Off-System Rail Grade Separation State 22 Fund Program. 23 (7) Project—A project that is eligible for funding under 24 this subchapter. 25 (8) Project sponsor—An entity described by \$7.122(b) of 26 this subchapter (relating to Program Eligibility). 27

- 1 §7.122. Program Eligibility.
- 2 (a) To be eligible for funding under the program, a project
- 3 must:
- 4 (1) be for the construction of a grade separation
- 5 structure that will either eliminate one or more adjacent at-
- 6 grade rail-highway crossings or provide a grade-separated
- 7 pedestrian-rail crossing;
- 8 (2) be located off the state highway system;
- 9 (3) increase public safety, enhance economic
- 10 development, or reduce traffic; and
- 11 (4) constitute a logical, self-contained unit of work
- 12 that can be constructed as an independent project whether it is
- 13 proposed as an independent project or as a part of a larger
- 14 transportation project.
- 15 (b) To be eligible to request funding under the program,
- 16 the project sponsor must be the political subdivision of the
- 17 state that has jurisdiction over the project's location,
- 18 authority to undertake the project, and authority to enter into
- 19 the agreement required under \$7.132 of this subchapter (relating
- 20 to Project Implementation).
- 21 (c) The crossing may involve either freight or passenger
- 22 rail.

- 24 §7.123. Funding and Eligible Costs.
- 25 (a) Funding under the program is subject to the Texas Grant
- 26 Management Standards developed by the comptroller under
- 27 Government Code, Chapter 783.

- 1 (b) Planning, detailed design activities, environmental,
- 2 right of way acquisition, and utility adjustments are eligible
- 3 costs.
- 4 (c) A cost is not eligible for funding under the program if
- 5 it:
- 6 (1) was incurred before the department authorizes work
- 7 to proceed under the agreement required under \$7.132 of this
- 8 subchapter (relating to Project Implementation); or
- 9 (2) is related to rail capacity improvements or the
- 10 <u>addition of mass transit infrastructure.</u>
- 11 (d) A project may include elements that are not eligible
- 12 for funding under the program. Funds used to pay for those
- 13 elements do not qualify as matching funds under \$7.124 of this
- 14 subchapter (relating to Non-State Funding Match).

- 16 §7.124. Non-State Funding Match.
- 17 (a) In accordance with Transportation Code, §471.010(b), at
- 18 least 10% of the total project costs must be provided by a
- 19 source other than the state as matching funds, except that the
- 20 commission may adjust the minimum local matching funds
- 21 requirement for a project located in an economically
- 22 disadvantaged county in accordance with Transportation Code,
- 23 §222.053.
- 24 (b) Except as provided by this section, the funding match
- 25 required by this section must be cash provided by or through the
- 26 project sponsor. The value of donated services will not be

- 1 accepted as a funding match but may be used to reduce the
- 2 overall cost of the project.
- 3 (c) The project sponsor must provide the funding match
- 4 required by this section before the beginning of project
- 5 activities for each phase of work.
- 6 (d) The department's direct costs for the oversight of
- 7 preliminary engineering and construction of the project are
- 8 included as a part of the total project costs under subsection
- 9 (a) of this section.
- 10 (e) The participating railroad must share in the project
- 11 cost in accordance with 23 C.F.R. §646.210. This cost share may
- 12 count as part of the overall non-state funding match
- 13 requirement.

- 15 §7.125. Call for Project Nominations.
- 16 (a) Projects will be selected for available program funding
- 17 through a competitive process.
- 18 (b) The department will issue a notice of a program call for
- 19 project nominations that is published in the Texas Register.
- 20 (c) The notice will include information regarding the
- 21 required content of the nomination package, the procedures
- 22 applicable to the program call, and the specific evaluation
- 23 criteria to be used during the project selection process.

24

25 §7.126. Nomination Package.

- 1 (a) To nominate one or more projects during a program call,
- 2 the project sponsor must submit each nomination in the form
- 3 prescribed by the department.
- 4 (b) The nomination package must present persuasive evidence
- 5 of support for the proposed project from the affected communities
- 6 and, if applicable, include a commitment to provide the non-state
- 7 funding match required by §7.124 of this subchapter (relating to
- 8 Non-State Funding Match) or an explanation of the project sponsor's
- 9 eligibility for a funding match adjustment under Transportation
- 10 Code, §222.053.
- 11 (c) A complete nomination package must be received by the
- 12 department not later than the specified deadline published in the
- 13 Texas Register. A nomination package that fails to include any of
- 14 the items specified in this section or the respective program call
- 15 is considered to be incomplete and will not be considered for
- 16 funding.

- 17 (d) The department may request supplemental information as
- 18 needed to conduct project screening and evaluation.
- 20 §7.127. Project Evaluation Committee. The executive director will
- 21 appoint a project evaluation committee consisting of department
- 22 staff to make recommendations for the selection of projects funded
- 23 under the program.
- 25 §7.128. Nomination Screening.
- 26 (a) The project evaluation committee will screen each project
- 27 nomination to determine whether the project is eligible for funding

- 1 under the program and applicable federal and state law and whether
- 2 it meets technical standards established by applicable law and
- 3 accepted professional practice.
- 4 (b) The department will notify the project sponsor if a
- 5 project nomination is determined to be ineligible and the
- 6 reasons for the determination.
- 7 (c) A request for reconsideration of a finding of
- 8 ineligibility may be initiated only by email or letter from the
- 9 project sponsor to the director setting forth reasons in support
- 10 of a finding of eligibility. The email or letter requesting
- 11 reconsideration must be received by the director not later than
- 12 the 15th day after the day that the project sponsor received the
- 13 department's notification, as established by the return receipt.
- 14 (d) The determination of the director in response to the
- 15 request for reconsideration is final.
- 17 §7.129. Project Evaluation. The project evaluation committee
- 18 will evaluate the public safety, economic development
- 19 enhancement, traffic reduction, and any other benefit of each
- 20 nominated project that is determined to be eligible under
- 21 §7.128(a) of this subchapter (relating to Nomination Screening)
- 22 based on the specific selection criteria set forth in the
- 23 program call. Evaluation criteria will be provided for each
- 24 program call.

25

26 §7.130. Project Selection and Approval.

- 1 (a) The project evaluation committee will provide project
- 2 selection recommendations and supporting documentation to the
- 3 director.
- 4 (b) The project evaluation committee will recommend that at
- 5 least 10% of the total amount available in a program call go to
- 6 eligible projects that are located in rural areas, unless the
- 7 project evaluation committee determines that there are not
- 8 sufficient eligible project applications to reach 10% of that
- 9 amount.

- 10 (c) The director will review the recommendations and
- 11 supporting documentation submitted by the committee and will
- 12 select projects for funding under the program based on
- 13 recommendations from the project evaluation committee, consistent
- 14 with the statutory requirements and the evaluation criteria.
- 15 (d) The director will recommend projects selected under
- 16 subsection (c) of this section to the commission for approval.
- 17 (e) The department will notify the project sponsor whether
- 18 the project was selected and approved for funding.
- 20 §7.131. Inclusion of Selected Projects in Planning Documents.
- 21 If a project selected is to be implemented in a metropolitan
- 22 area, the department will request that the Metropolitan Planning
- 23 Organization for that area immediately begin the process
- 24 required to include the selected project in its Transportation
- 25 Improvement Program.

27 §7.132. Project Implementation.

- 1 (a) In undertaking a project, the project sponsor and the
- 2 participating railroad must comply with all applicable laws and
- 3 regulations, including all applicable state procedures and
- 4 requirements.
- 5 (b) All projects shall be developed in compliance with the
- 6 department's current standards and specifications.
- 7 (c) All project sponsors must enter into with the
- 8 <u>department an agreement that:</u>
- 9 (1) includes a commitment from the project sponsor for
- 10 the required non-state funding, if applicable;
- 11 (2) describes the total scope and course of project
- 12 activities;
- 13 (3) states the maximum amount of the funding provided
- 14 under this subchapter;
- 15 (4) designates the department to manage the project on
- 16 behalf of the project sponsor in accordance with Transportation
- 17 Code, §471.010(d); and
- 18 (5) outlines the responsibilities and duties of the
- 19 parties to the agreement.
- 20 (d) Before the department will fund any construction
- 21 activities, the project sponsor must enter into the agreement
- 22 required by subsection (c) of this section and demonstrate that
- 23 required opportunities for public involvement have been provided
- 24 and that all applicable environmental documentation has been
- 25 completed.

1	(e) Any change to the scope of work specified in the selected
2	nomination package must have the advance written approval of the
3	executive director.
4	(f) The department is responsible for the inspection, final
5	acceptance, and certification of a project.
6	
7	§7.133. Elimination of Project from the Program. The executive
8	director may eliminate all or a part of a project from
9	participation in the program if:
10	(1) the project sponsor fails to satisfy any
11	requirement of this subchapter or the agreement required under
12	§7.132 of this subchapter (relating to Project Implementation);
13	(2) implementation of the project would involve a
14	significant deviation from the scope of work in the approved
15	nomination package;
16	(3) the project sponsor withdraws from participation
17	in the project;
18	(4) construction has not been initiated within three
19	years after the date that the project was approved by the
20	<pre>commission; or</pre>
21	(5) the agreement required under §7.132 of this
22	subchapter (relating to Project Implementation) is not executed
23	within one year after the date that the project was approved by
24	the commission.
25	

- §7.134. Reporting to the Commission. Annually, the department 1
- will submit a report to the commission on the project nominations 2
- and projects approved for funding. 3
