


EL PASO/FAR WEST TEXAS TRUCK PARKING ACTION PLAN



The Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) is finding solutions for safe truck parking through the development of a Truck Parking Action Plan for El Paso/Far West Texas. The plan builds upon TxDOT's 2020 Statewide Truck Parking Study.

Safe truck parking impacts the safety of all motorists. However, truck drivers often have great difficulty finding safe truck parking, often resulting in truck drivers parking on shoulders, ramps, and other places that impact roadway safety.



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Safety

In Texas, 2,315 crashes involved a parked commercial truck, causing 138 fatalities and 997 injuries (2013-2017)

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Time and Money

Due to the lack of parking, truck drivers lost:

- 9,300 revenue-earning miles per year
- \$4,600 in pay per year



Factories, distribution centers, border crossings and other places typically assign drivers a time for pickup and deliveries. Most places do not provide staging areas, which leads to drivers parking and waiting on frontage roads and local streets.

Truck Parking Needs & Challenges



Commercial truck drivers need safe places to park when they encounter road closures or severe congestion due to natural disasters or emergencies.



Many cities, counties and neighborhood associations have rules prohibiting or limiting truck parking in residential neighborhoods. This leaves owner/ independent drivers without a place to park their truck during time off.



Federal regulations dictate the amount of time drivers are allowed to drive and the length of required breaks. The lack of parking facilities means drivers often park in unauthorized and unsafe locations.

The Action Plan will provide recommendations to:



Reduce crashes involving parked trucks through new and expanded truck parking facilities.

Improve safety of parking facilities.

Improve resiliency by considering emergency truck parking needs during severe weather events.



Reduce damage to state property caused by unauthorized parking on shoulders and ramps.



Address truck parking staging needs in/near freight-intensive areas.



Consider parking needs for off-duty owner-operators.



Identify opportunities to address freight impacts on overburdened communities.



Support private-sector truck parking development and innovation.




Leverage existing technology to solve truck parking challenges.
