


Share The Road: Look Twice for Motorcycles Campaign, May 2025

The Texas Department of Transportation is launching its annual Share the Road: Look Twice for Motorcycles campaign to alert drivers about the risks motorcyclists face and the precautions motorists can take to protect them. Look twice: there's a life riding on it.



In a crash, motorcyclists are vulnerable to serious injury or death.

- Per vehicle miles traveled in the U.S. in 2022, there were 22 times more motorcyclist fatalities than car occupant fatalities.
 (NHTSA, June 2024)
- In 2024, 581 riders lost their life and 2,534 were seriously injured. (ΤΧDOT, 2025)

Driver Safety Tips

- **1. Keep motorcyclists in mind.** Always check for any nearby, especially at intersections.
- **2. Look twice.** Check blind spots and use your turn signals before changing lanes.
- **3. Turning left?** It can be hard to judge a motorcycle's speed and distance, so let them pass first and use your turn signal.
- **4. Keep a safe following distance.** Motorcyclists can slow by downshifting, which doesn't activate their brake light.
- **5. Slow down.** Obey speed limits to keep both yourself and motorcyclists safe.
