## **TRAFFIC ALERT**

August 25, 2023

**HOUSTON** – As part of the ongoing <u>Texas Clear Lanes</u> project at I-610 /Cambridge Street, the Texas Department of Transportation will have a total closure of the I-610 South Loop eastbound frontage road from FM 521/Almeda Road to State Highway 288 beginning **Friday**, **August 25 at 9 a.m. until 3 p.m.** 

Crews will be removing old high-mast lighting poles to be replaced later with new high mast lighting along the new mainlanes of the I-610 South Loop. This closure and detour information can be found at the I-610/Cambridge <u>project website</u>.

As one of six (6) Texas Clear Lanes projects in the Houston area, it is designed to improve traffic flow and connectivity, reduce congestion, add capacity, create better connectivity with SH 288, and improve overall mobility in the surrounding area. Situated in South-Central Houston, the project prioritizes better connectivity between the Medical Center, major event venues such as NRG Stadium, Houston Central Business and Museum districts, Historic Third Ward, and multiple colleges and universities. The \$117 million project includes reconstruction of mainlanes, frontage roads, and the addition of a freeway overpass with eight direct connect tie-ins at I-610/SH 288. The eight direct connect tie-ins will complete and link the partially completed connector ramps already built as a part of the SH 288 Express Toll Lane project, completed in July 2022. Completion is expected in mid to late 2025.

Motorists may experience significant delays during the closure and should consider any alternate routes. Additional closure information can be found at <u>Houston TranStar</u>. Closures are subject to change due to adverse weather.

TxDOT appreciates your patience and reminds you to please drive with caution through work zones and be on the lookout for work crews and their equipment. Area residents should exercise caution if driving, walking, or biking near any construction activity.
