- o Consumer vs. fleet ownership models
- o Ownership vs. fleet
- What questions might auto dealers have from a seller's perspective?

OUESTIONS TO ASK

- What are you currently doing to educate on the technologies? (Ride-hailing, Dealers, etc.)
- o Develop and share full question list to folks beforehand.
- o Some of these questions deployers may not have considered these yet.

- What's the expectation for fleet turnover from the dealer perspective?
- Examine what features are standard and which ones are upgrades (may be ever-changing and by manufacturer--might be a snapshot in time)
 - How does your company communicate changes to the technology and ensure that consumers know the limits?
 - ➤ Advise companies not to provide proprietary information if they're not comfortable with it
 - ➤ Do we need to check with OGC about FOIA?
 - ➤ Develop language for question list
